OUT OF 1097 REGISTERED VOTERS- 104 CAST THEIR VOTE

Question 1.

"Shall the Town of Royalston be allowed to exempt from the provisions of proposition two and one-half, so-called, the amounts required to pay for the bond issued in order to purchase a hydraulic heavy-duty lift system for the Town Garage?" YES 61 NO 43

Question 2.

"Shall the Town of Royalston be allowed to exempt from the provisions of proposition two and one-half, so-called, the amounts required to pay for the bond issued in order to purchase a Vibratory Roller and Trailer with Dust Control for the DPW?" YES 65 NO 39

Actions taken at the Annual Town Meeting June 10, 2023

A-Hybrid Police Car	FAILED
B-Hydraulic Heavy-Duty Lift System for Town Garage	\$ 55,000
C-Vibratory Roller and Trailer with Dust Control	<u>\$ 80,000</u>

Article 15 B. To see if the Town will vote to borrow \$55,000 for the purpose of funding the purchase of a hydraulic heavy-duty lift system for the Town Garage, including all incidental and related costs; and to authorize the Treasurer, with the approval of the Select Board, in accordance with M.G.L. c.44, Sec.7 or 8, or any other enabling authority, to issue any bonds or notes of the Town therefor; and provided further, however, that the borrowing authorized hereunder shall be expressly contingent upon approval by the voters of the Town, of a Proposition 2-1/2, so called, debt exclusion question, or act anything thereon.

Article 15 C. To see if the Town will vote to borrow \$80,000 for the purpose of funding the purchases a vibratory roller and trailer with dust control, including all incidental and related costs; and to authorize the Treasurer, with the approval of the Select Board, in accordance with M.G.L. c.44, Sec.7 or 8, or any other enabling authority, to issue any bonds or notes of the Town therefor; and provided further, however, that the borrowing authorized hereunder shall be expressly contingent upon approval by the voters of the Town, of a Proposition 2-1/2, so called, debt exclusion question, or act anything thereon.
